Rules and Regulations

Please read the following rules and regulations and review them with your children.

Regulations for Swimming Pools Issued by Illinois Department of Public Health:

Glass containers are prohibited.

Admission to the pool shall be refused to all persons having any contagious disease; any infectious conditions such as colds, fevers, ringworm, foot infections, skin lesions, carbuncles, boils, diarrhea, vomiting, inflamed eyes, ear discharges; or any other condition that has the appearance of being infectious. Persons with excessive sunburn, abrasions that have not healed, corn plasters, bunion pads, adhesive tape, rubber bandages or other bandages of any kind shall be refused admittance to the pool. A person under the influence of alcohol or exhibiting erratic behavior shall not be permitted in the pool area.

The pool water is not suitable for drinking. Avoid swallowing pool water.

All persons are encouraged to shower before entering the pool.

Personal conduct within the pool facility must be such that the safety of self and others is not jeopardized. No running or boisterous behavior or rough play. Only supervised water sports are permitted.

Only clean footwear, baby strollers, or wheelchairs are allowed in the pool area or bathhouse.

Spitting, sprouting of water, blowing the nose, or otherwise introducing contaminants into the pool is not permitted. Glass, soap, or other material that might create hazardous conditions or interfere with efficiency operation of the swimming pool shall not be permitted in the swimming pool or the pool deck.

All apparel worn in the pool must be clean.

All children who are not toilet trained must wear a swim diaper, preferably with tight fitting rubber or plastic pants over them.

Diving into water less than 5 ft deep is not permitted; except when allowed for competitive swimming and training. Caution shall be exercised in the use of diving facilities.

Lifeguards are responsible for enforcing safety rules and responding to emergencies.

Parents or guardians MUST supervise their children at all times.

No one should swim alone.

The pool management has the authority to implement and enforce rules that are more stringent or that supplement those listed here.

In addition to the Illinois Department of Public Health Regulations, River-Aire Pool Rules include:

All swimmers ages 10-17 years of age who wish to use the pool without their parent(s)/adult present must pass a swim test and have a release form on file. This may be done at any time. The test consists of treading water and then swimming the length of the pool. Guests must also pass the test if they come to the pool without an adult. Swim test must be completed each year and signed by guardian.

Use of Main Pool

Non-Swimmers (defined as children needing a vest, arm floats, or other flotation devices in order to stay afloat) must have 1 adult per every 3 children in the water at arm's length.

Use of Baby Pool

Families using the baby pool, must keep their non-swimming children in the baby pool area, unless another supervising adult is with non-swimming children in the main pool.

6 years of age and younger only allowed in baby pool, including during "all kids out" in main pool.

No lifeguard on duty in baby pool.

NO non-swimming children allowed in the deep end or off the diving board without supervising adults present.

The pool manager and lifeguards on duty are responsible for enforcing the safety rules of the pool.

Food and drink are allowed to be brought in but must be kept out of the pool and behind the white line.

Parties over 10 guests must be reserved. Please go to snack shack or website for official form.

Pool inflatables/rafts are not allowed.

While using the diving board, goggles and swim masks are not permitted.

No removal of umbrellas or moving of tables on own. Please go to the snack shack for assistance.

Any person who disregards the above rules and regulations may be asked to leave the pool.

NO EXCEPTIONS TO THESE RULES WILL BE ALLOWED.
